

PROGRAMS

For over 50 years, Girls Inc. of San Diego County (GISD) has taken a holistic approach to whole-girl health and wellness by providing life-changing, no-cost, research-based programming.

GISD's three pillars of work along with a combination of skill development in a pro-girl environment equips girls to reimagine their futures; believe in themselves; pursue higher education and take their seat as tomorrows decision makers. Our curriculum aligns all three areas of our program model of **STRONG**, **SMART** and **BOLD**.

STRONG

508 GIRLS

STRONG programs focus on Mind + Body wellness, positive body image, stress management, and resisting peer pressure. We lay a foundation of physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing.

The **EmpowerHER** program is a comprehensive program model that incorporates lessons from across our STRONG, SMART, and BOLD program categories. EmpowerHER equips girls with the tools to improve their physical and mental health, increase their academic success, successfully transition to college, become civically engaged, and develop their leadership so that they may take their place at the table as tomorrow's decision makers.

SMART programs support girls' academic success by providing hands-on, mentor-driven explorations of STEM fields.

Future STEMinists develops girls' enthusiasm and skills in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Future STEMinists is designed to engage girls in STEM, through a holistic, project-based approach that connects STEM concepts to whole-girl themes.

BOLD

BOLD programs empower girls to become leaders and enact positive change through civic engagement, social justice and advocacy.



Eureka! is an intensive, five-year program that brings girls, including many who will be first-generation college applicants, onto local college/university campuses for a rigorous, STEM-based summer program. Girls begin the program as rising eighth graders and continue through high school graduation.

ALUMNA PROGRAM

Girls Inc. Alumna Program (Project Accelerate) will speed the entry of young women into positions of leadership with a dual strategy: by driving cultural change towards equity in the workplace, and by ensuring young women's educational attainment and skill development to facilitate compelling career trajectories.



YOUTH ADVOCATE

Areli began her Girls Inc. journey in Fall of 2020 as a high school sophomore. Areli's compelling testimony captured the attention of Girls Inc. National and was awarded a \$20,000 college scholarship as well as a speaking engagement opportunity at a National Luncheon in Beverly Hills in the fall of 2023. 


Dr. Sylvia Mah
